- We were able to settle a contract very early in the bargaining window, so early that I believe PEA and Perry Township were the first to ratify in our state. While that wasn't our goal, we feel like this year's contract negotiations went smoothly and allowed a good contract with a raise and no benefits increases to emerge. Furthermore, we continue to secure raises attached to your base salary. There are many districts that do not do this; your voice helps allow us to bargain this on your behalf.
- PEA saw a very good increase in membership. Our incentive program helped to garner new members, and as our numbers grow, so does the strength of our unified voice.
- I appointed Mike Slack (PMHS) to coordinate member events to help promote unity within our association and to allow us to remain unified. Our first event at Vino Villa in October was a hit. Stay tuned for information regarding our next event, which will take place in the spring. ### Health and Wellness Center News

If you have tried to get an appointment at the HSBT Health and Wellness Center, you know that the schedule is very full. Because of demand, HSBT will open two more centers—one near Speedway and one on the east side. The speedway center should open March 1, 2015, and the east side location will open later in the spring.

To better accommodate patients, the hours have recently changed:

Monday	9:00-6:00
Tuesday	8:00-5:00
Wednesday	8:00-5:00
Thursday	8:00-5:00
Friday	6:30-3:30

The Health and Wellness Center does accept walk-in patients for acute care, but the wait time may be long as patients with an appointment will be seen on time. Walk-in patients will not be seen for wellness care such as physicals. For all visits, please schedule an appointment if possible. Call 497-6140 or go to [www.mywebahead.com/hsbt](http://www.mywebahead.com/hsbt). **Remember, there is no office co-pay for the Health and Wellness Center, and wellness coaches are available for free to help with your health goals.**

### Employee Assistance Program

You have access to Anthem's Employee Assistance Program (EAP). You are able to receive face-to-face counseling, crisis consultation, legal assistance, and other services.

You will hear more early next year, but our EAP plan is changing to offer you more services. For now, access the plan by calling 800-647-9151 or go to [www.anthemead.com](http://www.anthemead.com) and enter company code "Hoosier School Benefit Trust." Your use of the program is **completely confidential**; neither Perry Township nor HSBT is told who uses the program.

### The Cost of Your Benefits

When determining your salary, you should include the cost of your benefits. On December 19, the last pay of the calendar year, look at the box on the bottom right corner of your paystub. It shows the amount that Perry Township pays for your benefits; you may be surprised by the amount. PEA has been able to bargain some of the best benefits in the state because of the strength of our membership.

### New Insurance Cards

In January, Anthem will issue new insurance cards for everyone with HSBT coverage—not just those who are changing plans. As our AEP provider is changing (see above), that phone number will no longer be printed on the new card. Continue to use 800-647-9151 until you receive the new number.
